


# DANCEZING NEWS

### SALSA SOLO

Our new step this week was Suzy Q - (just like doing the twist with your legs crossed) We are practicing the steps to slower tracks and putting routines together while picking up the pace. As well as dancing to traditional salsa music we are also using Latin pop music. I love dancing to Shakira & this week we danced to 'Hips Don't Lie'. I've got more great tracks lined up for you - the Latin music is fab isn't it?

As well as saxophones, trombones & trumpets, percussion instruments play a big part in salsa music:

Bongos - two small drums attached to each other, originated in Cuba

Claves - a pair of short dowels 20-30mm thick, traditionally made of wood

Conga - African descended drum, sets of 3 - quinto drum has the highest pitch, segundo - middle and tumbadora, the lowest.
